

Babergh Council Tax 2026/27

Frequently asked questions

How much has my bill gone up by?

Babergh District Council has increased by 2.99%
Suffolk County Council has increased by 4.99%
Police and Crime Commissioner has increased by 5.16%

For a Band B property in Babergh this equates to:

Babergh District Council 9p per week
Suffolk County Council £1.23p per week
Police and Crime Commissioner 22p per week

How much Council Tax Reduction have I been awarded?

Detail of the amount of Council Tax Reduction awarded is shown on the front of your bill, or you can view your account online at www.babergh.gov.uk/ctaccount

I think my Council Tax Reduction is wrong – what do I do?

You should contact the Council and tell us why you think it is wrong.

I have already told the Council that my circumstances have changed or that I have moved, yet my bill still shows the old information.

The bills were produced based on the information on our system as at the end of 24th February 2026. If you contacted us on or around that date, your bill will still show the original information. A new bill will be issued when we have dealt with your most recent correspondence.

My circumstances have changed, and my bill needs updating.

I pay by Direct Debit – do I need to do anything?

Your Direct Debit will automatically carry over from one billing year to the next and we will collect instalments on the date shown. If, however, you change address, please remember to ask us to transfer your direct debit to your new account.
