

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

BABERGH DISTRICT COUNCIL (GLEMSFORD RESTRICTED BYWAY NO 34(PART) AND FOOTPATHS NOS 34X(PART) AND 35(PART)) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2023

On 23 June 2023 Babergh District Council confirmed the above order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the order as confirmed is to divert the following restricted byway and public footpaths in the vicinity of Sluice Gate Cottage at Glemsford as described in the order and as shown on the order map:

Glemsford Restricted Byway No 34(part) – The entire width of that part of Glemsford Restricted Byway No 34 commencing at Ordnance Survey grid reference (OSGR) TL84454714 and proceeding in a north easterly and then northerly direction for approximately 92 metres to a junction with Glemsford Footpath No 35 at OSGR TL84504721 then in a north north westerly direction for approximately 4 metres to a junction with the publicly maintainable highway (U7339) at OSGR TL84504722 to a new line commencing at OSGR TL84454714 and proceeding in a northerly direction along a track for approximately 27 metres to OSGR TL84454717 then continuing along the track in a north easterly direction for approximately 62 metres to a junction with the publicly maintainable highway (U7339) at OSGR TL84484722.

Glemsford Footpath No 34X(part) – The entire width of that part of Glemsford Footpath No 34X commencing at a junction with the publicly maintainable highway (U7339) at OSGR TL84504722 and proceeding in a north north easterly and then northerly direction for approximately 163 metres to OSGR TL84574737 to a new line commencing at OSGR TL84484723 at a junction with the publicly maintainable highway (U7339) and proceeding along a track in a north easterly direction for approximately 98 metres to the point where the track turns east south east at OSGR TL84544732 then continuing in a north easterly direction across a field for approximately 65 metres to join the existing route at OSGR TL84574737.

Glemsford Footpath No 35(part) – The entire width of that part of Glemsford Footpath No 35 commencing at OSGR TL84504721 at a junction with Glemsford Restricted Byway No 34 and proceeding in a south easterly direction for approximately 34 metres to the western end of a footbridge at OSGR TL84534719 to a new line commencing at OSGR TL84494722 at a junction with the publicly maintainable highway (U7339) and proceeding in a south easterly direction for approximately 15 metres to the southern edge of the driveway serving Sluice Gate Cottage at OSGR TL84504720 then continuing in a south easterly direction for approximately 15 metres to OSGR TL84514719 then in an easterly direction for approximately 19 metres to join the existing route at the western end of a footbridge at OSGR. TL84534719.

The order comes into force on 16 October 2023 but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from 30 June 2023, make an application to the High Court.
